Commissioner Meeting October 2, 2018

Commissioner Joel Hamar called the meeting to order at 9:00. Present were Thor Sand, John Hokana, Marke Roberts, Dean Simek and Chairman Joel Hamar. The media was not present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Additions to the agenda

Bidding process and the Pheasant Lake project

Treasurer Gail Veland joined the meeting at 9:10.

Hokana made a motion to approve the September 18th Commissioner meeting and the Preliminary budget hearing minutes. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Simek made a motion to approve the vouchers, with the additions in the amount of \$9.75 for payback of overpayments for paper service and the decrease in one bill for an overcharge for a hotel room. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

Commissioner Sand reported on a conversation with a concerned Pheasant Lake resident concerning the bidding process and the current Pheasant Lake project. The resident was concerned if the project currently being completed at Pheasant Lake was bid out as required by North Dakota Century Code, as well as the effect the project will have on the channel. Commission discussed that the current project is to be completed as part of three separate projects and that each project is completed when the yearly budget and grants received for projects is feasible with the current budget. A suggestion was made to install swim buoys which will be discussed at the next Park Board meeting. Sheppard will check with States Attorney Jeff Glynn concerning the 3 phase projects and the bidding process at Pheasant Lake.

Sand spoke with another resident also stated the concern on accepting propane bids from a firm outside of the county. Commission stated they prefer to do business with county businesses, but have to take the lowest acceptable bid. Sheppard will check with States Attorney Glynn on the status of accepting bids that are not the lowest acceptable bid, because the business is located in Dickey County.

Hamar reported to the Commissioners that Tax Director Don Flaherty had shared with him concerning a resolution being presented at the ND Association of Counties conference next week to remove the farm residency exemption from Century Code. Retired farmers would be able to maintain their exemption.

Sand made a motion to nominate County Agent Breana Kiser as the delegate for Dickey County at the State Fair annual meeting. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Sheppard requested that the motion from September 18th for the new visa card for the Courthouse be clarified, per the request of Dakota Plains Credit Union. Sand made a motion to set the credit limit at \$4,000, with Wanda Sheppard, Stormy Bertsch, Gail Veland, Cheryl Brokaw, Andi Schimke, Cresta Miller, Don Flaherty, Denise Olson, Deborah Anderson, Kelly Schmidt, Scott Peterson, Ray Peterson, Holly Hokana, and Jeff Glynn as approved signers. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Health District Administrator Roxanne Holm and Deputy Treasurer Cheryl Brokaw joined the meeting at 9:50.

Holm reported on the request from Xcel Energy for a septic system. Holm has given the information to Xcel Energy concerning the county's requirements. A plan has not been filed so decision can be made on the easement request until the plan has been approved.

Brokaw presented the Commission with the six properties that will be available for sale in November if taxes are not paid. The minimum bid for each parcel will need to be set. Sand left the meeting at 10:10 for an appointment.

The final 2019 budget was reviewed, for any possible cuts in expenses. Roberts made a motion to decrease the Job Development Authority budget for 2019 by \$60,000. This money was allocated for assisting day cares in Dickey County. Simek seconded. Motion carried. Simek made a motion to approve all remaining budgets for 2019. Roll call vote was unanimous with Hokana yes, Roberts yes, Simek yes, and Hamar yes.

The meeting went into recess at 10:15, and reconvened at 10:35.

Sheriff Chris Estes, 4-H Agent Aimee Ellinger, and County Agent Breana Kiser joined the meeting at 10:35.

Ellinger informed the Commission that she had submitted her resignation to NDSU and her last day will be next Wednesday, October $10^{\rm th}$.

Kiser updated the Commission on the drone purchased, that it has not been flown. They are waiting to be certified. Discussion followed concerning what the drone will be used for and what type of insurance is needed. Kiser plans to use the drone for education and may use it for looking for the noxious weed, palmer amaranth. Sheppard will check into the logistics of insuring equipment that is not completely owned by the county. Commission discussed needing a user agreement with the weed board. Kiser will put together a user agreement and review with the weed board at their next meeting.

DES/911 Coordinator Charlie Russell and resident Eric Larsen joined the meeting at 10:45.

Larsen presented a map showing work that shows how the water drains in front of their shop and the changes Larsen would like to make in the county right of way. Larsen planned to provide the

labor and the culvert, but was informed by his attorney that the county would have to do it because of the wetland easements on the land. The water would drain to the north end of Dickey County Drain #1. Commission asked if Larsen had met with the water board and he stated that he hadn't. Larsen felt that the drain would not cover 80 acres, and therefore the water board would not have to get involved. Discussion followed concerning wetland easements and issues other land owners have had to deal with. Larsen will do more research on this issue and will come back to the Commission with more information.

Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen joined the meeting at 11:00.

Simek made a motion to open the propane bid hearing. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

The bid hearing is for the propane for the 2019 heating season. The bid is for 20,000 gallons more or less. Three bids were received. They are:

Farmers Union Oil \$1.20/gallon

Economy Propane \$1.30/gallon

North Star Energy \$1.189/gallon

After discussion concerning keeping the business local, Roberts made a motion to accept the bid from North Star Energy for \$1.189 per gallon for 20,000 more or less for the 2019 heating season. Hokana seconded. Discussion followed concerning keeping the supplier within the county for one more cent. North Star Energy is the propane department of AgTegra, who employs people in the county. Roll call with Hokana yes, Roberts yes, Simek no, Hamar yes. Sand was absent. Motion carried.

Simek made a motion to close the bid hearing. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

KLJ Engineer Chad Petersen joined the meeting at 11:10. Petersen reminded the Commission of the bid opening on October 19th for the bridge project. Petersen reminded the Commission of the ND Department of Transportation meeting at the ND Association of Counties meeting on October 8th at 1:30.

Hagen presented to the Commission a utility permit from Wanzek Construction for work along County Road #5. Hokana made a motion to sign the permit. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Hagen also presented five permits from SE Water Users. They are along County Road 10 and 12. Hokana made a motion to sign the permits. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Hagen stated the gravel crushing is done. Highway department will start Monday mowing ditches. Work is being done east of Oakes to replace two culverts.

Hamar reminded the Commission of the 5 County meeting Thursday in Forman. The Village training will be held Thursday morning from 8:30 to 11:00.

Hokana made a motion to adjourn at 11:40.

Engineer Interview Committee Meeting November 8, 2018

The meeting began at 8:50 with Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen and Commissioners Thor Sand and Dean Simek in attendance. Auditor Sheppard was also in attendance.

Proposals have been received from two separate firms, Kadrmas Lee and Jackson, as well Interstate Engineering. Two favorable reference checks were completed on both firms.

KLJ staff Chad Peterson, Shawn Mayfield, and Jason Manlove joined the meeting at 9:15 am and made their presentation. The presentation was followed by questions by the Committee. KLJ staff was thanked for the proposal and they exited the meeting.

Interstate Engineering staff Ben Aaseth and Mike May joined the meeting at 10:20 and made their presentation. The presentation was followed by questions by the Committee. Interstate Engineering was thanked for the proposal and they exited the meeting.

The Committee ranked the two companies. All parties stated this was not easy as they were very close on all areas. After tallying the results, KLJ had a one point advantage over Interstate Engineering.

Discussion followed concerning the interviews. Interstate Engineering had pointed out some issues that may save some time and money on the project. The Committee felt that though the rating showed an advantage to KLJ, they felt that after the discussion that a decision to go with Interstate Engineering would be better for Dickey County.

Sheppard will check with ND DOT on the issue since the rating system is different than the direction the Committee is considering. Sheppard will report back to the Committee after talking with Brian Fuchs with ND DOT.

Meeting was adjourned at 11:30.

Treasurer Gail Veland, and Clerk of Court Andi Schimke joined the meeting at 9:50.

Simek made a motion to approve the Financials for September. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

The survey results from The Village training completed on October 4th were reviewed. Discussion followed concerning forwarding the survey results to all employees. Based on the results, ideas for training for next year's training sessions were recommended.

Veland presented her Quarterly Treasurer's Report for third quarter, 2018. Roberts made a motion for Chairman Hamar to sign the report. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

Sheppard presented an application for a raffle at the Oakes Golf Club on November 30th, along with a temporary liquor license for Harvest Inn for the same event to raise funds for the Oakes Area Community Foundation. Hokana made a motion to approve the raffle permit and the temporary liquor license application. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Sheppard presented two deeds for parcels that were originally taken over for unpaid taxes as of October 1st. Parcel numbers 10168000 and 10169000 have been paid and will be deeded back to the original owners. Simek made a motion for Chairman Hamar and Auditor Sheppard to sign the deeds. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen, Tax Director Don Flaherty, Xcel Energy representatives Sean Lawler and Warren Sakry, and Wanzek Construction representative Pete Nelson joined the meeting at 10:22.

Lawler informed the Commissioners that the ND Department of Health had approved the plan for the septic system for their operations building. Commission do not require anything else at this time for the septic system. Sakry and Nelson gave an update on the project.

Sheriff Chris Estes joined the meeting at 10:40.

Hagen informed the Commission that Elm Township has agreed to the change in the rate on the agreement for maintenance of roads in Pheasant Lake. Hagen will get the new agreement signed. Hamar informed Hagen of the thank you given by the Park Board for their removal of the dock at Pheasant Lake.

Sheppard presented the Maintenance Certification from the ND Department of Transportation, which needs signatures stating that the County continues to maintain the federal aid roads in a good and safe condition. The form is to be signed by the County States Attorney, County Auditor, County Chairman, and the County Highway Superintendent. Roberts made a motion to sign the maintenance certification. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Estes updated the Commission on the number of applicants received for the Deputy Sheriff position. Estes plans to have the person hired and patrolling county roads by the end of November.

Commission reviewed the four properties that have not been paid for three-year taxes. Values were set for the four properties for these properties for the November 20th land sale, if taxes are not paid by that time.

KLJ Engineer Chad Peterson joined the meeting at 11:00.

Peterson updated the Commission on the federal aid report discussed the meeting at the Association of Counties conference last week. Because of other states not using their federal funds, Dickey County will receive approximately an additional \$114,000 for 2019.

Peterson informed the Commission that the two highway safety programs have been approved and are currently on the list for 2020. They are on County Road 8 and County Road 14. Peterson said they stated that we could trying to move it to 2019, and they look at available funds after the new Federal Aid Program sheet for 2019 is received.

Peterson presented the design engineering agreement in the amount of \$15,000 for the seal coat project for 2019 on County Road 3 west of County Road 8 to Highway 281 and County Road 2 south of Highway 11 to the State Line and the north 9 miles of County Road 2. Simek made a motion to sign the agreement. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

A discussion on a door that needs to be replaced at the Highway Department was discussed. Once a quote is received, a decision will be made as to what should be done.

Hokana made a motion to adjourn at 11:20.

October 30, 2018

Commissioner Joel Hamar called the Bridge Project Proposal Opening to order at 8:00. Present were Thor Sand, Marke Roberts, Dean Simek and Chairman Joel Hamar. Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen and Treasurer Gail Veland were also present. The media was not present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Two proposal for the construction engineering for bridge project number BRC-100(020), PCN 2205 have been received. A proposal was received from Interstate Engineering and Kadrmas Lee and Jackson. Commission reviewed the proposals received and the list of questions to be asked to the two vendors. After further discussion, another question was added, along with another rating score on the score sheet.

Hagen will contact the two firms to set up interviews for the morning of November 8th. The Committee of Simek, Sand, and Hagen will meet at 8:30 to check references, with the first interview to be at 9:30 and second interview to be at 10:30.

Meeting was adjourned.

Chairman Hamar called the Commissioner meeting to order at 8:58. Present were Thor Sand, John Hokana, Marke Roberts, Dean Simek, and Chairman Joel Hamar.

Additions to the agenda

Bid for door at highway department

Hokana made a motion to approve the October 16th minutes. Simek seconded. Motion carried. Simek made a motion to approve the bills. Roberts seconded. Motion carried,

Hamar presented an issue with the cost of living salary increases, brought to him by an employee. The issue was that cost of living increases are not given to employees who do not receive their pay step increases until the first of the month following their anniversary date. The cost of living percentage is based on the past 12 months of detail from the Department of Labor. After further discussion, Sand made a motion to change the cost of living adjustments for all employees will be on January 1st, with the step increase at the anniversary date. The goal of making this change is to have equitable increases. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Veland presented the Schedule E of the Dakota Plains Credit Union ACH agreement. The authorized representatives list includes the Treasurer, Deputy Treasurer, Auditor, and Deputy Auditor. Simek made a motion for the Chairman to sign. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

Sheppard presented two tax deeds for property originally taken over by the county for non-payment of taxes. The taxes have been paid and the deeds are recording the land back to the original land owner. The parcel numbers are 08080000 and 08540000. Hokana made a motion to sign the deeds. Roberts seconded. Motion carried.

Sheppard presented an agreement signed by Elm Township for the maintenance of the roads at Pheasant Lake. Commission felt a correction needed to be made on the wording of how the fee was figured. The Commission also felt a due date of April 1st should be included in the agreement. Sheppard will forward to States Attorney Glynn for correction.

Sheppard presented a contract for the transfer of all or some municipal court ordinance cases to direct court for the city of Oakes. The agreement is signed by the city of Oakes and needs to be signed by the County Commission. Roberts made a motion to sign the agreement. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

A quote had been received from Mertz Lumber for an exterior door at the highway department, in the amount of \$3,950. Commission felt that clarification was needed on the quote, as well as a quote for other options that would fix the issue without too much expense. Hagen will let DES/911 Coordinator Charlie Russell know to check into more information on the door.

NDSU District Director Ron Weiderholt joined the meeting at 9:45. Weiderholt stated that at the current time, the 4-H Agent position can't be filled. At this time, there are budget restraints at the state level. Once the Governor's budget comes out in December, Weiderholt will have a better idea of the timing when the position can be filled. Weiderholt will give the Commission an update as soon as he has more information.

Sheppard had received an e-mail from Oakes City Auditor April Haring concerning her resignation from South Central Dakota Regional Council Loan Committee. Her recommendation is to appoint Emily Ptacek in her place. Roberts made a motion to appoint Emily Ptacek. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

KLJ Engineer Chad Petersen joined the meeting at 10:05. The bid opening for the bridge project on October 19th had the lowest bid of \$487,088.50 with Swingen Construction Company. A resolution was received from ND Department of Transportation has been received asking the county to accept the bid. Petersen stated their suggestion would be sign the resolution. Their bid was within- \$19 of KLJ's original estimate. Sand made a motion to sign the resolution. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

There was a discussion concerning a drain complaint received yesterday. Sheppard had heard from Moore Engineering that the issue was a tile application approved by the Dickey County Water Board and that the resident would need to file a formal complaint with the Water Board. Sheppard will make sure that the Water Board has contacted the resident.

Hagen stated that Capital I is currently installing the new wings on the snow plows. Hagen presented an agreement for gravel crushing with Scott Musland, which Sheppard will sign. Roberts requested that Hagen look into County Road 10 just south of Dickey County Road 3.

A plan for the 5-County meeting to be held in Dickey County on December 6th was discussed. We will want to invite all legislators representing the five counties, as the meeting will be before the legislative session starts. Sheppard will look into possibly setting up a time to tour the changes at Trinity Bible College. We may be able to have the meal and meeting at the college.
