Simek made a motion to approve the vouchers. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Sand made a motion to approve the financials for March 2020. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Sheriff Chris Estes joined the meeting at 9:30 and updated the Commission on the applicants for the Administrative Assistant position. Estes plans on interviewing the middle of next week.

Treasurer Wonada Lematta joined the meeting at 9:40 to review the Quarterly Treasurer's report with the Commission. Hamar made a motion to approve the report and for Vice Chairman Hokana to sign. Simek seconded. Motion carried

Commission asked for an update of staff in the meeting on the status of how things are going, a concerning the courthouse having limited staff in the building at one time. Barriers were discussed. Sheppard updated the Commission on the new Courthouse Facebook page. Hokana asked that anything put on that site would be forwarded to the Commissioners, as they do not all frequently access Facebook.

KLJ Engineer Bryan Tykwinski joined the meeting at 9:56.

Health District Director of Nursing Lauri Wang joined the meeting at 10:01 and updated the Commission on the status of Covid 19. Discussion followed.

Sheppard updated the Commission on the electronic proposals for the road safety projects on County Road 8 and County Road 14. Two proposals were received, one from KLJ and one from Interstate Engineering. A committee will need to set up to interview the two candidates, as Federal funds will be used for the construction engineering on that project. Sheppard will send the question list used during the last interview process. Hamar made a motion to appoint Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen, along with the Highway Portfolio, Commissioners Sand and Simek, to complete the interview process and present a recommendation to the Commissioners at the next Commissioner meeting. Sand seconded. Motion carried. Sheppard will set up the meetings and get the information to the Committee.

Flaherty updated the Commission on the township Equalization meetings. Flaherty had forward to Commission an updated ad for the County Equalization meeting on June 4th. Flaherty had sent an updated ad for the county equalization meeting, showing the Zoom meeting. Sand made a motion to have County Equalization meeting changed to a Zoom meeting and have Flaherty have the ad put in the paper. Simek seconded. Discussion followed concerning changing the times slightly since the meeting will be on Zoom. Motion carried. Flaherty will update the Commission at the next meeting.

Hamar updated the Commission on the information he had collected on the value of the mower to be sold. Hamar made a motion to place an ad for the mower in the local paper and on line with a minimum bid of \$3,000, with the right to reject any and all bids. Sand seconded. Motion carried. Hamar will get pictures of the mower for the advertisement on line.

Hokana updated the Commission on the issue of County Road 5 and the load limits. The producer came up with another solution and the load limits will not have to be taken off.

Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen joined the meeting at 10:45.

Discussion followed concerning Dickey County #1. Tykwinski stated that they felt a drain project would be feasible there to get the water to the James River. The project will not be a quick fix and will take more than a year to finish the project. Tykwinski will speak with his water resource group to get a rough idea of the cost. Tykwinski discussed the option of putting the project through as an ER project, so that federal funding could be used to fix the problem. Based on the advice of Tykwinski and Hagen, Sand made a motion to give KLJ permission to proceed with the preliminary research on County Road #1 and the research on the project turned in as an ER project. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

A discussion on the budget for the Highway department included culverts. The amounts purchased for township use takes a lot out of the Road budget. A new line in the budget will need to include those culverts, which would be offset by the revenue of the sale of those culverts.

DES/911 Coordinator Charlie Russell joined the meeting at 11:10.

Discussion followed concerning County Road 10 north of Highway 11. The road has areas that are hazardous.

Radermacher stated she had not received any information concerning the electric poles in the right of way by Forbes. A decision was made to discuss at the Covid 19 meeting on Friday. The number of poles in the right of way needs to be confirmed.

Tykwinski updated the Commission on the safety project on County Road 8 and County Road 14. The bid opening awarded the contract to Strata Corporation at a lower cost than projected. KLJ has worked with the contractor on several jobs.

Russell updated the Commission on repair of the Guelph Tower, which was struck by lightning. The communication equipment for 911 purposes needs to be repaired and is currently being worked on.

There will be another meeting to update Commission on Covid 19 on Friday, April 24th at 2:00 pm on Zoom.

Hamar made a motion to adjourn at 12:05.

April 24, 2020 Special Commissioner Meeting via Zoom

Chairman Marke Roberts called the meeting to order at 2:00. Present were Thor Sand, John Hokana, Joel Hamar, Dean Simek, and Chairman Marke Roberts. Holm updated the Commission on Covid 19. The attention currently is to get more testing. Testing will be done at Bobcat in Gwinner. Dickey County Health District may have to help with some of the calling after the testing has been done. Discussion continued concerning the wearing of masks and if it will be a requirement to open business back up or not. Russell will work on getting options for the offices.

Sheppard presented the resolution from ND DOT on the results of the bid opening on April 17th. The contract was awarded to Strata Corporation in the amount of \$169,806.48. Sheppard read the resolution that the ND DOT has requested the Commissioner sign. Sand made a motion to sign the resolution sent by the DOT. Simek seconded. Roll call vote with Sand yes, Hokana yes, Hamar yes, Simek yes, Roberts yes. Motion carried.

Radermacher updated the Commission on information she had received back from MDU on the power poles in the right of way. MDU acknowledges they are in the right of way. Additional equipment will need to be used to remove the one pole, which is not in Dickey County at this time. A decision has to be made as to how many are in the right of way and are needed to be moved. MDU is requesting additional time to get the largest pole out. MDU is willing to sign a form, accepting the liability of the large pole, if the Commission agree to extend the time to get the pole out. Commission asked that Jeff go check the number of poles in the right of way. On the recommendation of Assistant States Attorney Radermacher, Hamar made a motion to accept the plan by MDU to remove the smaller poles now and to extend the time to move the larger pole, with MDU accepting liability for the larger pole. Sand seconded. Radermacher will put the paperwork together for MDU to sign. Roll call vote with Sand yes, Hokana yes, Hamar yes, Simek yes, and Roberts yes. Motion carried.

Roberts updated the Commission on a request he had received from Red River Valley and Western Railroad concerning repair of railroad repair needed north of Oakes. They are needing to replace rail from Oakes to Glover, as well as Oakes to Gwinner. They are requesting support of the

county in requesting grant money through the Rural Economic Development. Discussion followed. Hamar made a motion to give the support to Red River Valley and Western Railroad to secure the funds to make a better infrastructure for their business and Dickey County. Sand seconded. Roll call vote with Sand yes, Hokana yes, Hamar yes, Simek yes, and Roberts yes. Motion carried.

Another meeting to update Commission on Covid 8 is set for next Friday, May 1st.

Schimke thanked the Commissioners for their willingness to look out for the health and safety of all the employees. Commission reiterated the fact that if there is anything else that can be done, that staff should call and make them aware of those things.
