

June 2, 2020
Commissioner Meeting

Chairman Marke Roberts called the meeting to order at 9:07 am. Present were Thor Sand, John Hokana, Joel Hamar, Dean Simek and Chairman Marke Roberts. Also present were employees Danielle Dinger, Don Flaherty, Shirlene Wagner, Deb Anderson, and Samantha Pernsteiner via Zoom. Fair Board President Kacey Holm was also in attendance via Zoom.

Additions to the Agenda

County Roads

Update on Dickey County Fair

Sand made a motion to approve the minutes with corrections. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Hokana made a motion to approve the vouchers. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

Holm updated the Commission on the County Fair, scheduled in July. Due to Covid-19, the grand stand events have been postponed until 2021. Fireworks will be done July 10th, as scheduled. There will be the free feed in Ellendale and Oakes, served as a drive through in each city on June 28th. The Board is still working out some kind of 4-H achievement day for the kids. There will be no beer gardens. More details will be advertised as plans are finalized.

Assistant States Attorney Kim Radermacher, on Zoom, and Clerk of Court Andi Schimke joined the meeting at 9:25.

Dinger introduced Samantha Pernsteiner, who will be interning with the County Agent's office this summer and funded through NDSU. Pernsteiner assisted the office last year prior to the county fair.

Risk Manager Cresta Miller joined the meeting at 9:30 to update the Commission on money received from ND Association of Counties for programs in the area of safety compliance in the amount of \$1,704.91 and a premium dividend credit of \$7,053.66 for workers comp.

Discussion concerning a new position at the County to assist with the handling of FEMA paperwork for the four disasters that Dickey County currently is involved in. There is significant time needed to assist the county, townships, and cities to get paperwork filed so that funds can be received. The position could be partially funded with the administrative fee that is reimbursed to the county through the disasters. The position would, as time permits, offer assistance to other offices during times of need. Sand made a motion to create a new Administrative Assistant position, seeking applicants for a floating county employee to prioritize on FEMA activity, with other duties as time allows. Hokana seconded. Sheriff Estes, DES/911 Coordinator Charlie Russell, and Auditor Sheppard will interview candidates. Motion carried. Sheppard will put an ad in the newspaper for the next two weeks.

Deputy Tax Director Denise Olson joined the meeting at 9:50. Flaherty and Olson updated the Commission on the county values to be discussed at the County Equalization meeting Thursday, June 4th. The handouts were reviewed and discussed. Flaherty informed the Commission that there was a loss of value due to the change in the Farm Residence Exemption in the amount of over \$3,000,000. The values fall within the parameters required by the state of North Dakota.

DES/911 Coordinator Charlie Russell, Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen, Risk Manager Cresta Miler, and Health District employees Amber Miller and Roxanne Holm joined the meeting at 10:12.

Holm read through the proposed policies the Committee is proposing concerning Covid-19 and the reopening of the county offices.

KLJ Engineer Bryan Tykwinski, residents John Quandt and Andy Seyer, Sheriff Chris Estes and Administrative Assistant Andrea Masse joined the meeting at 10:30.

Hamar made a motion to accept the Covid policy as an employee policy, as presented by the Committee. Simek seconded. Roll call vote with Hamar yes, Sand no, Hokana no, Simek yes, Roberts yes. Motion carried.

The Work procedures related to reopening were reviewed with the Committee. Discussion followed concerning the access of the courthouse to the public, as it is a public building. With some adjustments, Hokana made a motion to approve the work procedures. Joel seconded. Motion carried. Sand and Hokana stated that with the changes made to the procedures, they are in support of the employee policy passed earlier.

The Committee brought before the Commission a quote from Dickey Rural Networks to install a Video Door Intercom at the front door to the Courthouse, like that which is installed at the Human Services/Health District building. DRN representative Travis Anliker joined by Zoom during the discussion. After some discussion, Anliker will put together another proposal to have an intercom system where each office could be called from the front door and people arriving could be given access to the office they are visiting. The proposal will be reviewed at the next Commissioner meeting. Funding for the system was discussed. Sheppard stated that the expense could be submitted for funding through the CARES funding.

Quandt gave an update to the Commission on the Dickey County Rd #3 east of Oakes drain application sent to the ND State Water Commission. Quandt presented the answers he had compiled to the questions that will be asked during the emergency hearing that is required to have before the

application would be approved by the Water Commission. Quandt will contact the railroad about having a conversation with the Commission concerning their part in this project. Sand made a motion to advertise for bids in the paper the next two weeks to dig the Dickey County #3 East of Oakes Drain, while waiting for the approval of the application from the ND State Water Commission. The bid opening will be June 26th. Dean seconded. The start date would be no sooner than 15 days after permit approval by the State Water Commission. Motion carried.

Hamar made a motion to declare a Critical Road Emergency on Dickey County #3 east of Oakes, due to sole access for some households, road endangerment, railroad access, and township and county access. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

Tykwinski stated he spoke with Strata Corporation concerning the safety project to be completed in 2020. Strata is planning to start the project the end of July. The roads will stay open during construction.

Tykwinski presented a Task Order for the ER Project on Dickey County #1. Roberts stated he would entertain a motion to sign the KLJ task order for ER Project of Highway #1. Simek made the motion. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

Hagen presented a Utility Permit from Southeast Water Users to install pipe along Dickey County #3 for a half mile. Hamar made a motion to approve the permit. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Estes and Masse discussed with the Commission on options of where the Sheriff's office would be housed during the basement project and the different options they had found in the County. Sheppard stated that the architect firm is asking if the county plans to proceed with the project and proceed with the bidding process. Sand made a motion to proceed with basement project as it currently set. Hamar seconded. Motion carried

Hokana made a motion to adjourn at 1:30 pm.

June 4, 2020

County Equalization Meeting

Commissioner Thor Sand called the meeting to order at 1:15. Present were Joel Hamar, Dean Simek, and Thor Sand. John Hokana and Marke Roberts were not in attendance. Also, in attendance were Tax Director Don Flaherty and Deputy Tax Director Denise Olson were also in attendance, along with residents Donna Retzlaff and Esther Retzlaff. Ellendale City Auditor Candy Middlestead and Assessor Rod Rodningen were in attendance via Zoom. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Sand turned the meeting over to Flaherty.

Flaherty reviewed the changes in values for the cities of Oakes and Ellendale. Based on the prior land sales in the city of Ellendale, the sales ratio is at 86.6% and has been adjusted to 94.9% to bring the city within compliance with the state of North Dakota. In the city of Oakes, the sales ratio was at 103.4%, which was lowered to 96.7% to bring the city within compliance with the state of North Dakota. Flaherty asked for any requests for adjustments.

Donna Retzlaff is requesting a decrease in the value of her home. Retzlaff stated that with the low commodity prices, Covid 19 issues, and concerns of money due to the things going on, that the Commissioners would take that into account and lower the value of her home. Olson gave the Commissioners a breakdown of a sales comparison of her house to other houses that are the same. The house had not been assessed in four to six years, and probably has been underassessed. Sand stated that an increase in value doesn't always mean an increase in taxes. The Commission can keep in mind the state of the current economy while completing budgets for the tax year of 2020. The value of the home is comparable in value to other houses of that type. Discussion followed that there may be other ways to ease the increase, such as homestead credit for Esther Retzlaff.

Seeing there were no other requests before Commissioners on residential property in the cities of Ellendale and Oakes, Flaherty continued on to Commercial property. Over all the sales ratio in Dickey County was at 94.2% for commercial property and the county's value is at 92% which is at the acceptable level with the state of North Dakota. The City of Ellendale is at 90.9% and the City of Oakes is at 94.2%. There were adjustments to some property in the TIF district in Oakes, as they were over assessed.

Flaherty asked for any questions on commercial property within city limits of Oakes and Ellendale. Seeing none, Flaherty moved on to townships and agricultural land.

Flaherty stated that the number from the state on agricultural land in Dickey County would need to average at \$916.62, which the county needs to be within 90% to 100% of that number to be in compliance. The agricultural value for ag land in Dickey County at this time is at \$852.51 which fits within the parameters set by the state of North Dakota. Discussion followed concerning the fact that non-cropland increased 5.28%, while cropland only increased 2.91%.

Flaherty discussed the difficulty of sales comparisons on residential and commercial outside city limits because of the lack of sales comparisons.

Flaherty presented two letters of protest from land owners, Heim Brothers and Scott and Traci Musland, with wind tower bases with the new Foxtail Wind Tower project. Based on Century Code, the landowner is assessed for the base and the tower is centrally assessed through the state of North Dakota. Based on the calculations given, there is currently a \$6,000 value added to those parcels that have a base on them. Flaherty reviewed the calculation based on IAAO standards that he used to compute the amount. The calculation includes taking 2 acres out of ag land value and placing the \$6,000 as a commercial value on that two acres. By taking out the 2 acres of ag land, the ag land value will decrease.

Flaherty stated that by the landowner signing their easement, they are agreeing to the increase. Flaherty stated other neighboring counties are using a similar process. Some counties are putting a larger value that Flaherty did in Dickey County's case. Dickey County's value was on the lower one-third of the values placed on the bases. Discussion followed concerning if the tower adds value to the property or not. Sand asked about the value of a commercial acre lot and what the value of that would be on an average and Flaherty stated it would be more than \$6,000. Flaherty will inquire with other counties as to how they are computing the increase in value for the base.

Discussion followed about not penalizing them for more income to the landowner, but the value placed on the land is backed up by the calculation. Neither party came to their township equalization meeting to discuss this.

Flaherty stated that at this time there were 26 properties in Dickey County's tax basis that were affected by the change in the farm residency exemption. The effect on the true and full value of the county was reduced by \$3,147,000.

Hamar made a motion to accept the values as presented by Flaherty for county equalization. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Hamar made a motion to adjourn at 2:15. Sand seconded. Meeting adjourned.

June 16, 2020

Commissioner Meeting

Chairman Marke Roberts called the meeting to order at 9:18. Present were Joel Hamar, Thor Sand, Dean Simek, John Hokana, and Chairman Marke Roberts. Also present were staff members Kerry Waldo, Wonada Lematta, Samantha Pernsteiner, Don Flaherty, Shirlene Wagner, and Chris Estes by Zoom.

Hokana made a motion to approve the minutes from June 2nd and Jun3 4th with corrections. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Simek made a motion to approve the vouchers, to include \$76 for post office box rental, payment to election workers of \$748.10, and pending approval of the bills from the Water Board, vouchers for the water board in the amount of \$2,207.52 for bills to be approved at the Water Board meeting tomorrow, June 17th. Hokana seconded. Motion carried.

Hamar made a motion to approve the financials for May, 2020. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

Additions to the agenda

Election update

Estes requested to hire a person to scan paperwork on the server so there is a digital copy of their paperwork, instead of paper. Estes is figuring approximately two to four weeks to complete the project. Work will be not be done during business hours, so that it doesn't disrupt the office. After some discussion, Sand made a motion to allow Sheriff Estes to hire a part-time short-term employee for records retention in the Sheriff's office for approximately 6 weeks, Simek seconded. Motion carried. Simek made a motion to pay the part-time person \$15 an hour. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

Staff members Danielle Dinger, Roxanne Holm, Cresta Miller, Amber Miller, and Dickey Rural Network representative Travis Anliker joined the meeting at 9:56. Staff member Deborah Anderson joined via Zoom.

Dinger updated the Commission on plans for the County Fair and the possible need for additional assistance from the county for costs incurred this year, as fund raising has not been able to occur due to Covid 19.

Interstate Engineer representative Mike May joined the meeting at 10:28.

Dr. Tara Mertz-Hack joined the meeting at 10:26 to discuss her possible appointment as the County Health Officer. At the recommendation of the Health District, Hokana made a motion to appoint Dr. Mertz-Hack as the county health officer. Simek seconded. Motion carried.

Holm updated the Commission on the activities of the Covid 19 committee for reopening. The Committee feels that everything has been done to protect the staff and to be prepared for reopening. Anliker presented a quote for a multi-tenant video intercom system for the front door. It would allow residents to call an office when arriving for an appointment at the Courthouse. Because of the pandemic of Covid 19, Hamar made a motion to approve the purchase of the multi-tenant video

intercom system in the amount of \$11,346.35. Sand seconded. Sheppard will request CARE fund money to pay for the purchase. Motion carried.

Flaherty presented a procedure his office will follow concerning going to locations to assess properties. Commission were in agreement with the guidelines, which will be on file with the Auditor's office.

KLJ Engineer Brian Tykwinski and Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen joined the meeting at 11:03.

Interstate Engineering Mike May presented a change order for the south bridge on Dickey County Road 8, from last year's project. The south bridge settled and needs to be fixed. The change order in the amount of \$7,975 will fix the issue and will be submitted to ND DOT, as the original project was. The work will be completed by Border States Paving Inc. Simek made a motion to sign the change order. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

Tykwinski updated the Commissioners on the Emergency project on Dickey County #1. The cost of our portion for the permanent grade raise would be approximately \$250,000 but would not be completed until 2021. At this point, the damage reports need to be submitted and then we are locked in. After some discussion, Sand made a motion to submit the reports, as the road needs to be fixed. Simek seconded. Roll call vote with Hamar yes; Sand yes; Hokana yes; Simek yes; and Roberts yes. Motion carried.

Sheppard presented the contract for construction engineering services on the safety project for 2020 that Tykwinski had sent her. The form should be signed and forwarded on to ND DOT. Simek made a motion to sign the contract. Sand seconded. Motion carried.

Hagen updated the Commission on the work the Highway guys are doing. The staff is working on bad spots on the roads, as they can get to them.

Sheppard updated the Commission on the asbestos inspection that had been completed. There was additional testing that Legend felt needed to be done on the first and second floor. A quote in the amount of \$975 was included. Sand made a motion to continue and complete the additional inspection. Hamar seconded. Motion carried. Sheppard will seek information of Legend as to consequences of the basement project.

Sheppard informed the Commission there was meeting in Jamestown concerning the ranking of the grant applications received for CDBG grant money Wednesday June 24th in Jamestown. Hamar will attend the meeting.

Discussion followed concerning meeting dates to review 2021 budgets. A decision was made to meet July 14th and July 16th at 9:00.

Employees Roxanne Holm and Amber Miller rejoined the meeting via Zoom to discuss the reopening of the county offices, as that was not discussed earlier. Discussion followed that the situation is fluid and ever changing. The situation will be reviewed at each Commissioner meeting, in case things have changed. Discussion followed concerning leaving the door locked to limit access and to have staff back in the courthouse working. The staff would still want to encourage residents to make appointments, when needing to do business at the courthouse. Sand made a motion to have staff back to full time in the office full time, as of July 1st, while still maintaining social distancing, washing hands, limited access, and the Covid 19 protocol approved on June 2nd. Hamar seconded. Motion carried.

Hokana made a motion to adjourn at 12:55.

Dickey County #3 Emergency Drain East of Oakes Bid Hearing June 26, 2020

Chairman Marke Roberts called the meeting to order at 11:05. Present were Chairman Marke Roberts and Highway Superintendent Jeff Hagen. Joel Hamar, Thor Sand, Dean Simek were in attendance via Zoom. John Hokana was unable to attend.

The purpose of the meeting was to open bids received for the construction of the emergency drain on Dickey County #3 East of Oakes. One bid was received from Dakota Improvement Inc. in the amount of \$205,000.

Hamar made the motion to accept the bid and to award the project to Dakota Improvement Inc. Simek seconded. Roll call vote with Hamar yes; Simek yes; Sand yes; Roberts yes. Motion carried. Sheppard had checked with ND State Water Commission concerning the drain application to find out the status of the application, which is currently being reviewed. The project will need to start as soon as possible to meet the 90-day requirement for the emergency declaration requirements.

Simek motioned to adjourn the meeting at 11:15.
